The Exhibition:
An insight into the project of the century



bahnorama is a **joint project of the City of Vienna and the Austrian Federal Railways**. The information centre designed by RAHM architects consists of a tower and the exhibition building.

On **550 m² of exhibition area**, experience how this new **hub** of the trans-European rail network will provide faster train connections and increased **travel comfort from 2014**.

You will gain an insight into the **new neighbourhood** that is being created around the main station – with 550,000 m² of office space, 5,000 new **apartments** for some **13,000 people**, an 8 hectare **park** and an **educational campus** providing top quality of life.

At the centre of the exhibition, an **enormous model** of the area (scale 1:500) and a **3D flight simulation** bring the new neighbourhood to life. Finally, in **four exhibition modules** termed "Bahnsteige" German for "railway platforms", you will learn curious and interesting facts about the **planning, technical details** and **history** of the former Vienna Southern Station area and Eastern Station areas.



The Tower:
The view from bahnorama

With its height of **66.72 metres**, the tower is already visible from a great distance and is the **highest walkable construction wooden tower in Europe**.

Two **glass panorama lifts** take you to the 40 metre high **viewing platform** in about 40 seconds. From there, you can watch the new **international traffic hub** Vienna Main Station and its accompanying new neighbourhood growing right before your eyes.

The viewing platform offers a **brehtaking panoramic view of the construction site and of Vienna**.

The **café bahnorama** serves a quick and inexpensive snacks and is a great choice for breakfast or coffee and cake.

Ticket prices for panorama lift:

- Adults: € 2,50
- Children (up to 14th birthday): € 0,10
- Annual pass: € 10 (+ € 0,10 per ride)
